Our countryside has been fashioned by people and people can destroy it. Our Society is dedicated to caring for and enhancing our countryside. We expect things to change but we will help them to be changed carefully and we will put effort behind our words.

What sort of effort do we mean?

We have occasional conducted walks taking people to places they may not normally go and show them things they would not normally notice.

We publish books and leaflets of walks.

Then we help farmers, landowners and Parish Councils by providing volunteers to do tasks that could otherwise not be done. We clear glades, lay hedges, create haloes around veteran trees, remove invasive plants that choke the natural flowers.

A specialist group sets up and monitors barn owl boxes. In the 2017 season 114 barn owl chicks fledged from nest boxes which were put up and monitored by volunteers of The Barn Owl Group within the West Berkshire Countryside Society.

Another specialist group has been working for many years to recover the heathland on Bucklebury Common. The glorious purple heather and the returned nightjars are some of the results.
