

WBCS – Fires on sites

1 Preparation for a fire	3. Managing the fire
 Ensure that a risk assessment has been carried out and the findings recorded. <i>(see the SPRA)</i> All workers on site to be made aware of and comply with the controls identified. In case of emergency, be able to provide the emergency services with adequate information. <i>(see WBCS task SPRA)</i> Designated first aider and first aid kit, including eye wash, to be on site. No first aider=no work Erect warning signs and barriers if the public are likely to be affected. On ecologically sensitive sites fires are often restricted to a limited number of locations and require soil protection in the form of metal sheeting or other barriers 	 The fire should be managed by a nominated "Fire master". The fire master has the final word on the shape and size of the fire as well as the orientation of the material being loaded. Ensure that at least one person is always attending the fire Fire should be kept as small as possible to do the job Keep the immediate area around fire clear of tools and materials Fires should be turned in and made safe at the end of the day. If the owner/agent is on site, they may well choose to do this later
2. Location of the fire	4. Personal safety
 To avoid the spread of fire - fires should not to be lit: - On peat soil – ideally on non-organic surface In strong/gusty wind conditions In very dry or drought conditions Directly under trees To avoid smoke hazards Fire not lit near roads or occupied buildings As far as possible site fire to be downwind of workers Use hazard signs to exclude people from obscured area 	 PPE -To avoid burning embers and flying debris those working near the fire should wear head protection, eye shields, long sleeves, trousers and protective footwear Avoid working in significant smoke or for significant periods of time Workers should aim to work up wind of the fire
